Welcome to IRG 39 in Istanbul



The 39th Annual Meeting of the International Research Group on Wood Protection will be held on May 25-29, 2008 at the Military Museum and Culture Centre in Istanbul.

The conference venue is located at the Harbiye district just over half a mile north of Taksim (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Taksim_Square). The conference venue is located exactly in the heart of Istanbul and is situated in the European part of the city. The venue is located in one of the important centers of Istanbul and is close to the Bosphorus Strait, the center of the city's business, cultural and commercial life, surrounded by some of Europe's top quality hotels.

The Military Museum (http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Istanbul_Military_Museum) and Culture Centre (http://www.genelkurmay.org/askerimuze/kultur_sitesi.htm) at Harbiye are within walking distance to many local attractions and shopping centres. The old part of the city where Topkapi Palace, the Grand Bazaar and many other historic sites are located is within a 20 min. taxi drive. A leisurely walk to the shore of the Bosphorus takes about 15 min.

The Military Museum and Culture Centre complex includes a museum and conference area. The 39th Annual Meeting of IRG will take place in the conference halls of the Culture Centre.

Topkapi Palace



The **Topkapi Palace** (*Topkapı Sarayı* in Turkish) was the official and primary Istanbul residence of the Ottoman Sultans from 1465 to 1853. The palace was a setting for State occasions and royal entertainment, and is a major tourist attraction. The name translated from Turkish literally means the "Cannongate Palace", named after a nearby gate. Initial construction started in 1459, ordered by Sultan Mehmed II, the conqueror of Byzantine Constantinople. The palace is a conglomeration of four main courtyards and many smaller buildings. During its prime, up to 4,000 people resided in the palace.

After the end of the Ottoman Empire in 1921, Topkapı Palace was transformed by government decree on April 3, 1924 into a museum of the imperial era. The Topkapı Palace Museum is under the administration of the Ministry Of Culture and Tourism. The palace complex has over one hundred rooms and chambers and only the most important ones are accessible to the public today. The complex is guarded by officials of the ministry as well as armed soldiers of the military of Turkey.

The palace is full of examples of Ottoman style architecture and also houses large collections of porcelain, robes, weapons, shields, armours, Ottoman miniatures, Islamic calligraphic manuscripts and mural decorations, as well as a display of accumulated Ottoman treasures and jewellery.

Weather Information

The climate in Istanbul is generally similar to that of the Marmara region; summer months are warm and humid with very little rain especially between July-August. Winter months can be cold and wet with some snow but not as cold as some other areas of Turkey. Spring and autumn are mild and this is the best time for visitors.

Istanbul covers a huge area and it has so many topographic diversities that you can experience several different sub-climates in the same city. For example, the Bosphorus Strait and surroundings are dominated by a Mediterranean climate (dry summers and mild and rainy winters) but to the north you can notice a Black Sea climate (mostly rainy). Meanwhile you can experience a Balkan climate to the west (cold winters and snow) and there is a Anatolian Continental climate to its east (hot summers and cold winters). You can even experience completely different weather during the same day. Whilst it may be snowing in one area, you may notice the sun shining (but cold of course) on another part of the city.

In the springtime, especially between April-May and September-October, there is a very comfortable climate with around 15-25 °C (59-77 °F).

Advice on Clothing at IRG 39

The temperature in Istanbul in May is around 25°C. Although spring weather is generally warm, it is advisable to take a jacket, a light raincoat or umbrella for occasional rain showers and cool evenings. Hotels and conference halls are air-conditioned.

Papers

Papers for presentation must be submitted in MS Word format to the IRG Secretariat (irg@sp.se). Manuscripts should be produced electronically in accordance with the guidelines in IRG/WP 04-60184 (downloadable from www.irg-wp.com) which can serve as a template:

- Use A4 printing format
- All papers must be provided with an abstract and keywords (3-7)
- Use individual pages
- Graphs must be disconnected from spreadsheets
- Recommended font: Times New Roman or Arial
- Recommended font size: 11 or 12 points
- Files might be zipped when necessary
- Save document as MS Word file before submitting to the IRG Secretariat
- There is no need to send hard copies to the IRG Secretariat

Student Awards

Ron Cockcroft Award (RCA)

The aim of the RCA is to promote international research on wood protection through the IRG by providing financial assistance to selected persons to attend IRG conferences.

The RCA is intended primarily to assist post-graduate research students and active scientists, who, for financial reasons might otherwise be unable to attend an IRG conference. It is available to members and non-members. Normally, there can only be one recipient from the same institute the same year.

Applications for an award shall be submitted in writing to the IRG Secretariat by **15 December 2007**.

Gareth Williams Scholarship Award, sponsored by Arch Chemicals Inc

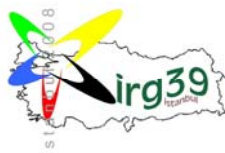

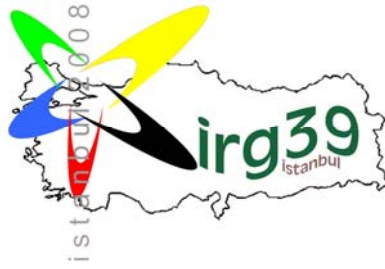
